# Geography



- The United Kingdom is made up of four nations- England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland.
- The **country** we live in is the United Kingdom. A **country** is a part of the world with its own borders and government.
- The United Kingdom is separated from Europe by the English Channel.
- A **capital city** is the main city of a country where a government is based.
- Using a atlas find where the 4 nations are located then colour, label and title map A.
- Using a atlas find where the 4 nations capital cities are located then colour and label map B.
- Finally label the English Channel, Irish sea and North sea.
- Take care with your colouring.



# Art and Design



- This half term we will be visiting Compton Verney to learn about the artist Pablo Picasso
  - We will be looking at a collection of Picasso's printmaking from 1920-1960. He used different techniques to create thousands of images.
  - Picasso was born in 1881 in Spain and although he is best known for his paintings in the cubist style he was also a talented sculptor and printmaker.
    - Your grid learning task is to create a piece of art work through printing.
- You can choose what you use to print with. Your image may be a repeating pattern of shape. The shapes may create a image of something else.

- This half term we will be looking at the traditional tale of Jack and the Beanstalk.

# Christmas Trees

- You will be making a small Christmas tree decoration using felt and decorating it.
- You will learn how to thread a needle and sew around the edges of your tree shape so you can fill it .
  - You will learn a simple running stitch.
- Decorate your tree and make a loop so it can be hung up.



# Christmas Crackers

- To begin you need to draw a plan of what your cracker will look like, think about colour, size and contents.
  - Your cracker must contain the following- a joke and hat.
  - The challenge is that you have to make and design all of these things yourself.
    - You can use any art materials in the classroom.
- Crackers were the creation of sweetmaker Tom Smith in London in 1845. He was trying to sell bon-bons wrapped in twisted paper like the French. It didn't work so thought it might be fun if there was a crack when the package was opened. The cracker was once called a 'cossaque' after Cossack soldiers who fired their guns whilst riding.
  - Crackers are now big business and famous for their awful jokes!
