

Geography



- The United Kingdom is made up of four nations- England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland.
- The **country** we live in is the United Kingdom. A **country** is a part of the world with its own borders and government.
- The United Kingdom is separated from Europe by the English Channel.
- A **capital city** is the main city of a country where a government is based.
- Using a atlas find where the 4 nations are located then colour, label and title map A.
- Using a atlas find where the 4 nations capital cities are located then colour and label map B.
- Finally label the English Channel, Irish sea and North sea.
- Take care with your colouring.




Art and Design



- You will aim to learn about the artist L.S Lowry and to understand why and how his art form developed.
- We will watch a short film in which L.S Lowry describes his style of painting.
- L.S Lowry was born in 1887 in Lancashire. He had a unhappy childhood. Where he lived there were lots of textile mills and chimneys. His pictures contain “ matchstick men” figures.
- Using the I pads find images of Lowry’s work. Use these to create your own piece of art work.




Science



- You are going to compare how things move on different surfaces - plain wood, foam, carpet underlay and sandpaper.
- You need to create a **fair test** so think about which parts of your test you must not change. Remember you are only testing different surfaces.
- **Friction** is a **force** between two surfaces that are sliding or trying to slide across each other.
- **Friction** always works in the direction opposite from the direction the object is moving.
- **Friction** always **slows** a moving object.

Once you have tested all the surfaces record your results and what you have learnt. We call this our conclusion.




Geography

Merry Christmas




- Your objective is to create a Christmas card for your family.

- If you choose to collage your design you will need to select what you need before you begin.




Christmas Wreaths

 - You are going to make a different kind of wreath using material.
 - You will need to thread the material through the holes and tie it in place.
